


We were not able to publicly honor our Silver Medal recipients until this year's convention either. These are the

Pioneer Achievement Award



Dr. Benjamin D. Hall

The late Dr. Ben Hall, Professor Emeritus of Biology and Genome Sciences at the University of Washington, was posthumously awarded the ARS Pioneer Achievement Award in 2020. He passed away in 2019 and since there was no convention in 2020, we were able to publicly acknowledge his achievement at this year's virtual convention. The Pioneer Achievement Award is designed to honor significant original research or outstanding achievement related to the genus Rhododendron. Dr. Hall used innovative techniques that he developed to study the genetics and evolution of rhododendron species. His citation is also posted on the awards page of ARS website.

Deciduous Azaleas by Steve Henning



Steve Henning has put together another very thorough article for the R & A News and this one is on Deciduous Azaleas. You will probably want to bookmark it for easy access. He describes all of our North American native azalea species as well as deciduous azalea species from other parts of the world.

He explains the differences between many older hybrid groups like Ghents, Knap Hills, and the Exbury Azaleas and includes the history of their development. He discusses modern groups as well including the very cold tolerant Northern Lights Series, heat tolerant Aromi hybrids, late blooming Weston introductions, and more.

Van Veen Nursery Custom Propagation



For nearly a century, the Van Veen Nursery in Portland, OR, has been a major wholesale nursery for rhododendron enthusiasts. Started by Theodore Van Veen Sr. in 1926 and then continued by his son, Ted Van Veen (Jr.), the nursery was eventually turned over to Ted's daughter, Kathy Van Veen. This nursery has been invaluable in providing custom propagation for ARS chapters and individuals.

Sadly, Kathy passed away in 2017 but she willed the nursery to the ARS so this invaluable resource would not be lost. Mike Stewart and Brenda Ziegler have been working with the Portland Chapter to get the place modernized and in good working order. If your chapter members want rhododendrons beyond the ordinary, find a few cuttings of the plants you want to grow and send them to Van Veen Nursery. They will send you back liners for you to grow. Details about how and when to send them cuttings can be found on their website. We also provide a link to a recent video of Mike Stewart talking about what is happening at the Van Veen Heritage Garden and Nursery.




Rhododendron Species Botanical Garden
