#### **Peter Cox**

"Peter Cox has had a long and distinguished career in the rhododendron world, being a specialist rhododendron nurseryman, a plant hunter and an accomplished horticultural writer. As a result, he is widely acknowledged both in the UK and abroad as one of the world's leading experts on rhododendrons. He has led or participated in many plant-hunting expeditions and plants grown from the seeds he has collected have been distributed to garden collections in over 20 countries. He is considered one of the world's most successful and skilled hybridizers of rhododendrons and alone or in conjunction with his father and son, has published 13 well-respected books on rhododendrons. In summary, the ARS is pleased to bestow its Pioneer Achievement Award on Peter Cox. Presented this 7th day of May 2022."

### Donald L Craig, Ph.D.

"From the early 1950's, as a youthful research scientist with a large passion for rhododendrons and azaleas, Dr. Donald Craig made the most of his position and networks to realize a serious breeding and selections program - engaging others including George Swain and Captain Dick Steele in major roles - that would put the genus Rhododendron on the ornamental plant radar and into garden landscapes of eastern Canada. His recognition of the genetic diversity of the genus, his collegial nature, his position as an Agriculture Canada small fruit breeder and division head, and his skill as a communicator made him an early and key player in the introduction, advancement and use of the genus Rhododendron in the Atlantic region. A true collaborator, Don continued to share his love of the genus and his plant breeder's knowledge with others until his passing in 2011. The American Rhododendron Society, in recognition of his accomplishments, is pleased to bestow the Pioneer Achievement Award on Dr Donald L Craig this 7th day of May, 2022."






